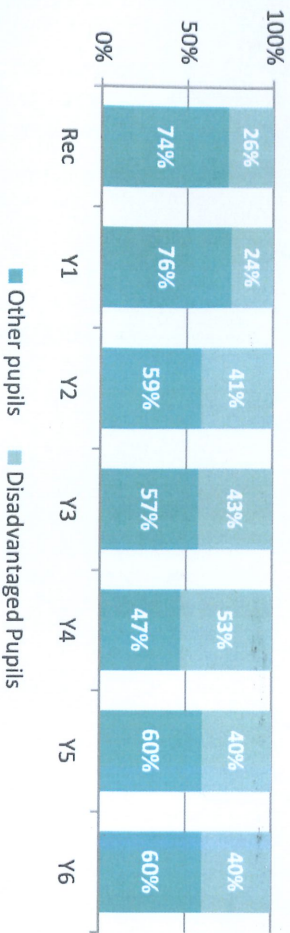

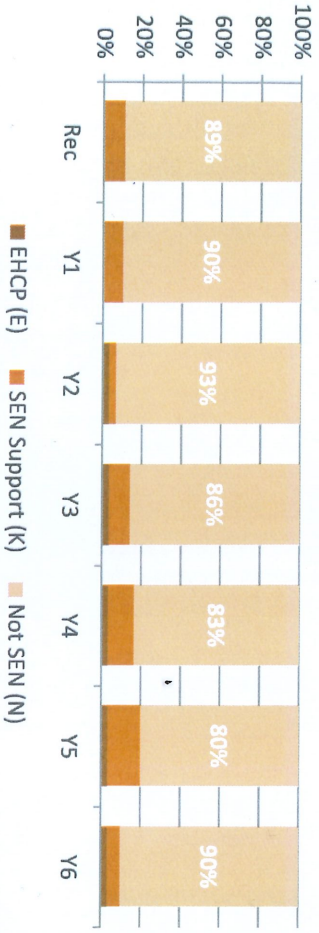

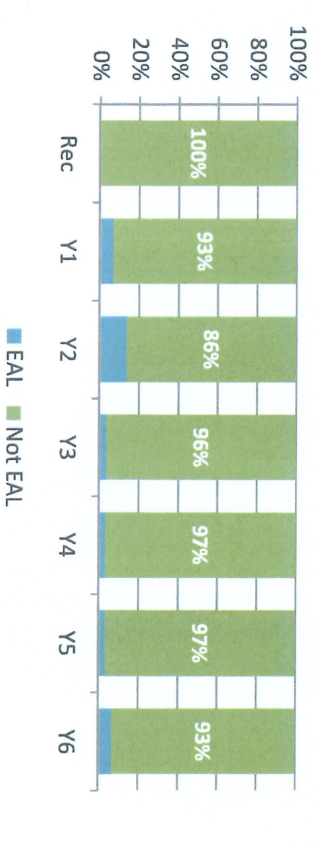

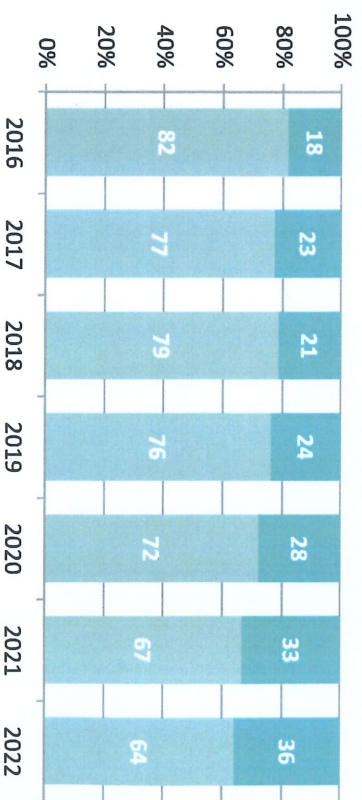

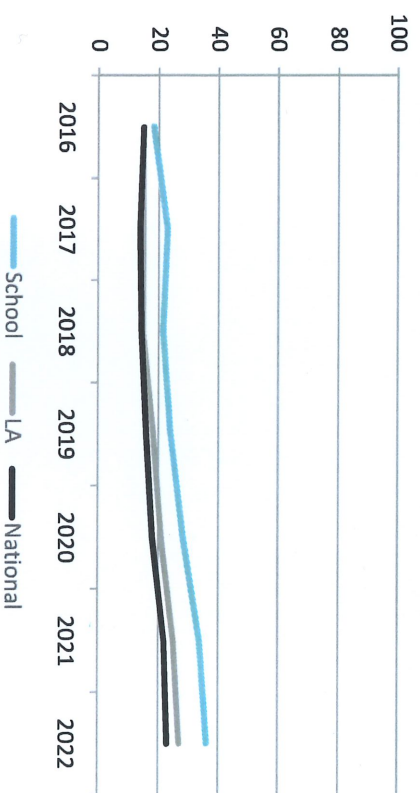

% Free School Meal Eligibility (Time Series)

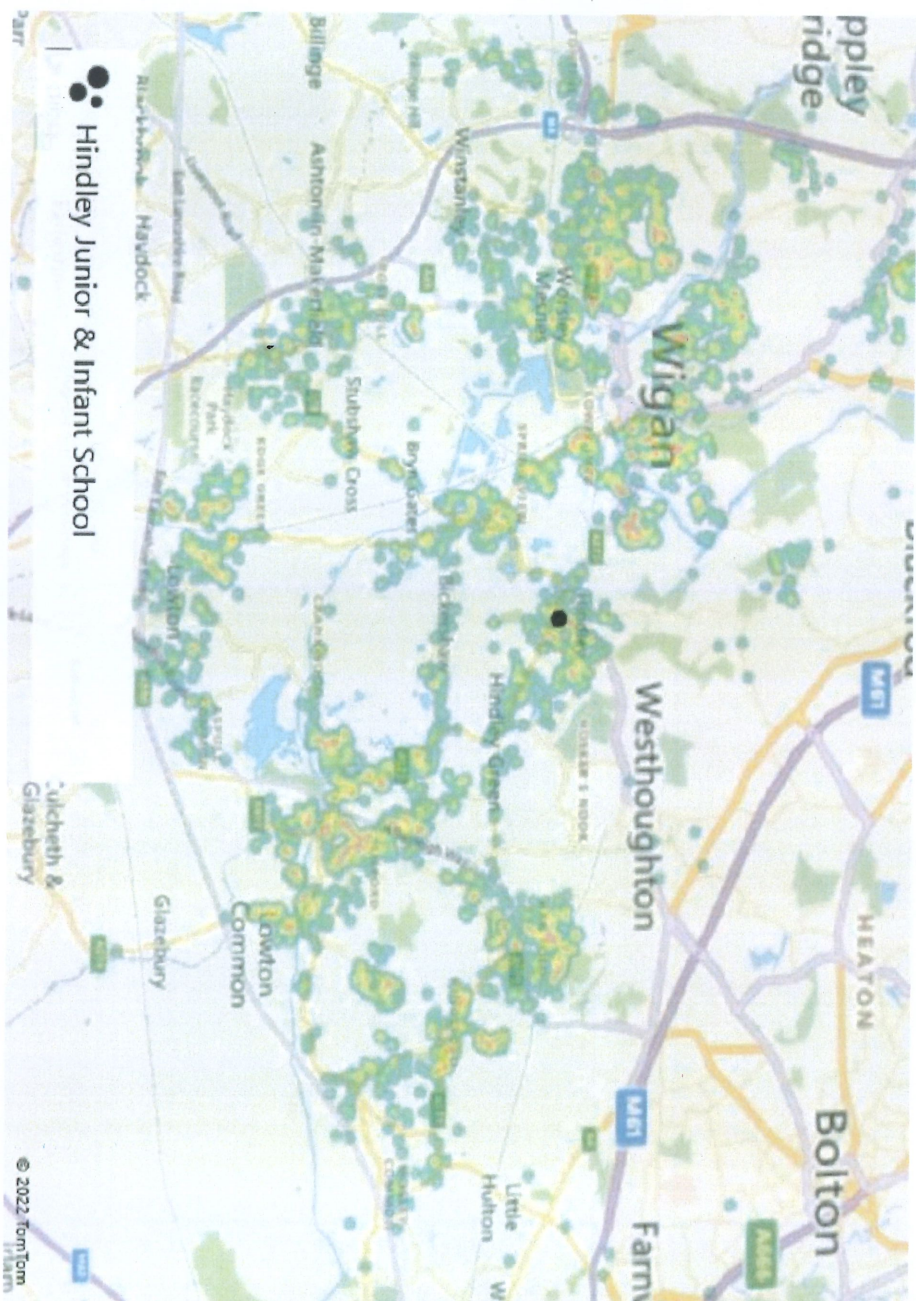


% Free School Meal Eligibility vs LA & National (Time Series)

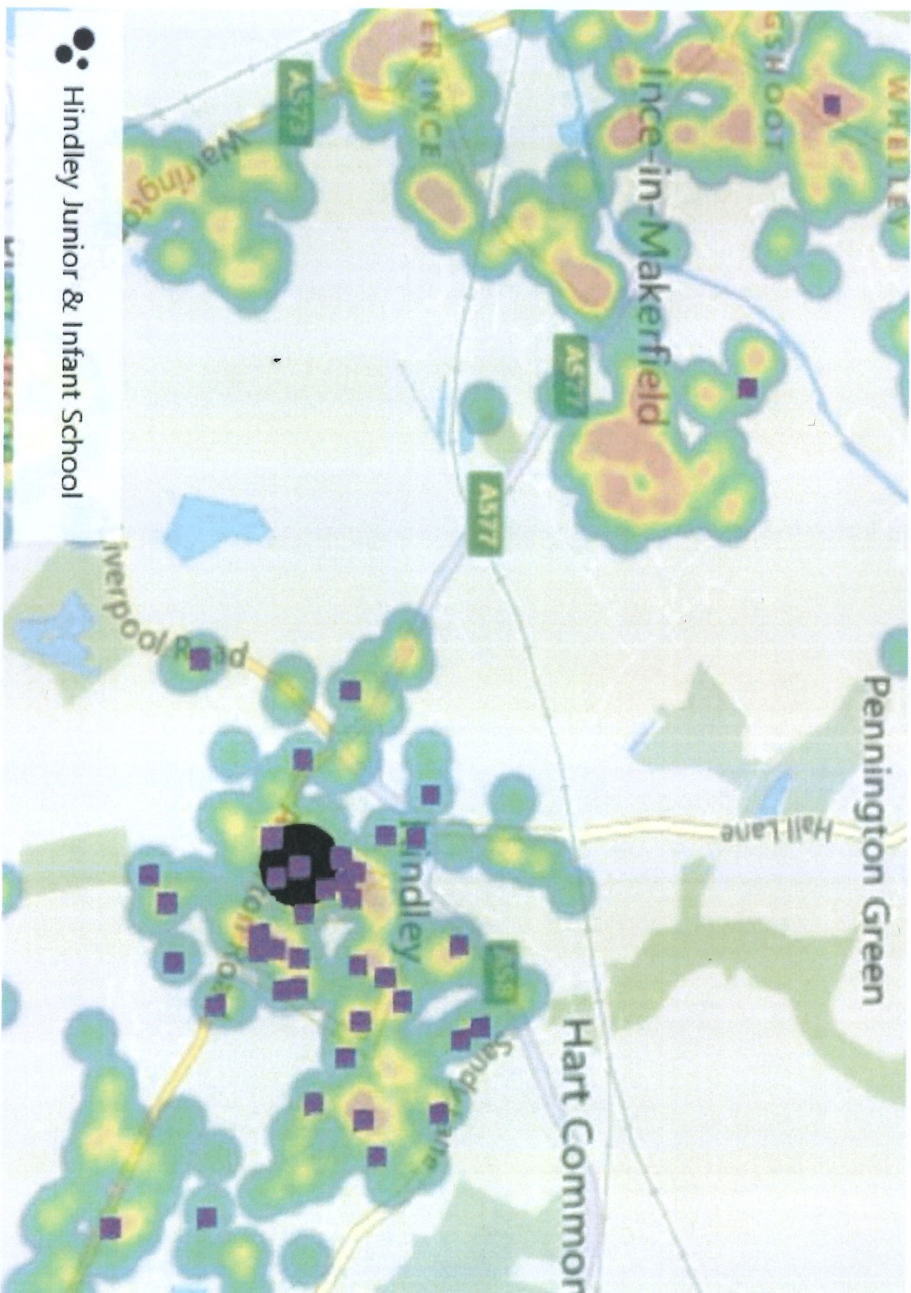

% of Girls/Boys by IDACI Decile



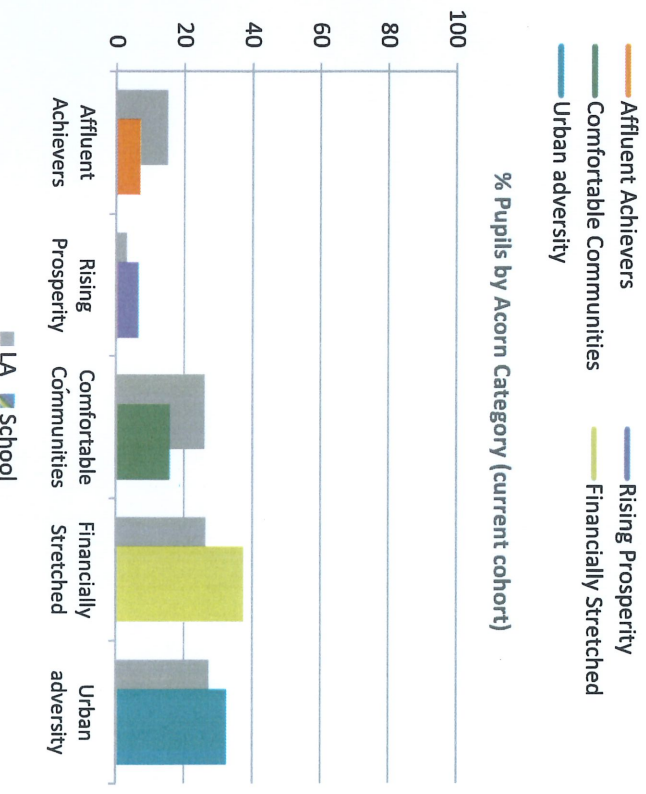
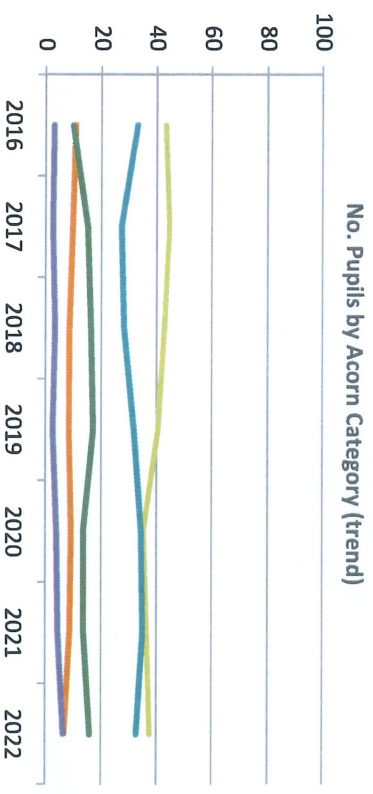
Context: ACORN

ACORN is an alternative way of examining the profile of a school's intake. ACORN is a commercial dataset produced by CACI Ltd. The data is available for all children at postcode level and allocates children to one of either five ACORN Categories (dependent upon where the child lives as per the School Census).
